Mark Saturday November 15th on your calendar so you don't miss our Fall Trash Bash!






### **Prescribed Burns**

## **Spring Wild Turkey Hunt**

Friday 25 April through Saturday 31 May 2025

Be aware that hunting throughout the St. Williams
Conservation Reserve is regulated under provincial and
federal legislation and is permitted according to provincial
and federal policy and legislation.

During the Wild Turkey Hunt, we discourage using the trails at dusk and dawn to avoid conflicts with hunting.

Always wear bright colors and be aware of your surroundings.
